

STOP! WE CAN'T WAIT MORE

Saturday, May 18 metalworkers mobilize and take to the streets in Rome because five years ago with the Berlusconi government had told us that the crisis was not there, was passing, even exceeded.

Over the past two years with the Monti government, given that the crisis could no longer be denied, it has gone to use the crisis to legitimize the policies of austerity across Europe. The results of this choice were: layoffs, increased social inequalities, impoverishment and inaccessibility to work.

MAY 18, IN ROME, the fiom manifested to give a better future to workers and migrant workers asking the new government:

- Freezing of layoffs, because for a foreign worker without Italian citizenship losing your job also means losing the residence permit. The production system must be raised through public and private investment.

- social safety nets and income: solidarity contracts should be encouraged and extended layoffs. Once exhausted the shocks must be provided for a form of income that also allows migrants to remain in Italy to look for a job and do not call into question the permanence of the family unit in Italy.

- cancellation of the Bossi purposes: it is not acceptable that migrant workers who have worked for years in Italy, producing almost 10% of gross domestic product, who send their children to school to build their future in this country, losing their jobs, they also lose the residence permit.

- fight lawlessness and the illegal hiring: also in the industry today we see new and worrisome forms of illegal hiring, especially by cooperative artisans. The penalties for employers who break the law and have certain guarantees for the immigrant complaint that their condition should be greater.

- Voting rights and citizenship to immigrants lawfully present in Italy and their children.

- reduction in the cost of the residence permit: a foreign worker in Italy to renew the residence permit may mean spending more than 250 Euros. The costs must be reasonable and should reduce the inconvenience to aliens seeking the issuance and renewal of residence permits, often forced to understaffing.
