Democracy at work

n February the 18th, Fiom-Cgil has called a national demonstration of metalworkers with a procession in Rome open to students, temporary workers, migrants and all those who have rallied in recent months throughout Italy for the common good, democracy, the rule of law, for the defense and the acquisition of a stable, decent and right job.

We know that the condition of our country since the extraordinary event of October 16, 2010 has worsened. Just think of the current attempt to expel the National Agreement and Fiom-Cgil from the Fiat factories, together with the silence of the institutions and politics. Indeed, while ensuring that workers are asked to have a sense of responsibility to the national interest, the Federmeccanica tries to erase the national labor contract. This is made possible due to the lack of democratic rules, which would entitle the workers to be able to decide and vote agreements that affect them. These are the effects of the political use of economic and financial crisis. While the rich are getting richer the poor are getting poorer, also you become poorer while you are working.

The industrial and manufacturing system in our country is at risk, we need a special plan for public and private investment to create jobs and change the pattern of development, including training, research, innovation and quality work, which must be the fundamental points of reference. This are the problems that the Government's policies have not addressed, indeed we are seeing a worsening of the pension system, a proposal to a further slide of the labor market to the precarious job and questioning of social safety nets, not seeing that the ones paying for restructuring or closure of entire supply chains are all the workers.

The increase in unemployment and unemployed people (especially young women), and underpaid black labor (particularly in the South) are fueling an atmosphere of depression and violence. Data on suicides due to the crisis and the raids against immigrants up to the murders of the past months should concern everyone. We believe that there is need for participation to this



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event to get out of the crisis and to safeguard

the common good, along with all those who want to change their status. Our first goal is the restoration of democracy at work.

AN EVENT FOR THE WORK AND THE NATIONAL CONTRACT OF FIAT.

The choice of national and multinational companies to restructure or even close entire plants

today are finding the only opposition of workers and employees. Even more serious and unacceptable in this context is that the Federmeccanica decides to continue on the way of the illegal agreements separated from the National Agreement, as it has done in recent weeks with the specific discipline about

the car manufacturing. We want to regain a unified national agreement shared by the metal workers to reunify the rights and prevent the race towards total deregulation and competition at work open by Fiat to extend in other companies and other sectors, as it is already happening for transportation.

With Article 8 - that we continue to ask to be deleted - propo-

sed by Fiat and made law by the Berlusconi's government, collective bargaining is being challenged in the companies.

In Fiat plants the closure of union halls, non-recognition of the Rsu, the Rls and the right of assembly for the Fiom-Cgil are the immediate representation of article 8. There is need for urgent intervention of the Government to ensure the constitutional rights in terms of pluralism and freedom of association (with the amendment to Article 19

of the Workers' Statute), together with the

need for comprehensive legislative action to guarantee the democratic right validation of collective agreements and election of united union representatives. In addition, we urge the Government to make transparent, verifiable and marketable the business plans of companies

starting from Fiat and from strategic

sectors such as steel, shipbuilding, production of aluminum, rail and urban transport with a new logic of mobility socially and environmentally sustainable.

AN EVENT FOR THE WELFARE, EDUCA-TION, ENVIRONMENT,

MONEY INCOME AND CITIZENSHIP AS COMMON AND INALIENABLE
HERITAGE.

The choice of the Government to move forward on the road to privatization of the common goods, with budget cuts in welfare, education and health, is in continuity with the previous government and in line with the obligations imposed by the European

Central Bank.

It confirms the decision to entrust to businesses, banks and finance the solution to a crisis they have caused. We need a real change from a fiscal policy that would prevent 10% of the Italian population to own nearly 50% of national wealth. It is urgent to ensure money income

to prevent the blackmail and guarantee citi-

zenship primarily to women, youth and migrants who suffer the first effects of a dramatic reduction in employment. For migrants is essential to have granted citizenship and voting rights as an element of civilization.

It is therefore inevitable for all of us oppose the idea of a reform aimed at increasing labor market flexibility. We need an extension of Article 18, of the layoffs protection plans and protections for small businesses. In addition,

the pension reform cannot be accepted because, in addition to rage over people who have already seen several times defer access to retirement, affects young twice: by blocking the labor market and clearing retirement. So it must be ensured prior conditions of access to pensions for all workers involved in the processes of crisis and re-definition of labor

agreements. There's a need to implement the use of the contract of solidarity to prevent layoffs, particularly in the South, to redistribute the work and not to reduce the duration of unemployment benefits. Indeed, in order to increase utilization of plants and for the hard workers, we think it is useful to provide tax incentives for the reduction of working time. Finally, we believe that for work, citizenship

and the common good we need a system of inviolable rights on a European basis which gives rise to a special plan to public and private investment to redefine a new environmentally sustainable production system.
